

# How do we discern the mission while on vestry?

- ★Reminder different from other non-profits
- ★Not just a business board with a chaplain either!

You might think serving on a vestry is like serving on a board of a nonprofit. They do share similarities: both are entrusted with the well-being of the organization each serves; both have officers; and both must abide by bylaws. A church vestry and a nonprofit board differ in one central way. The vestry is charged with the sacred task of the mission of the Church--"to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ".




