Primary responsibilities include playing the Casavant Opus 3928 Organ (2019; three manuals, 28 ranks, 33 stops) and supporting the congregation's worship through hymns and service music. This role offers the opportunity to collaborate with clergy and music staff in fostering a vibrant and growing music ministry.

Responsibilities:

• Provide organ service music (when appropriate, piano) for music portions of the

following services:

o Sundays 7:30 AM service (organ only)

o Sundays 10:00 AM service (congregational singing, accompanying choir, and

other service music)

Accompany choir for Wednesday evening rehearsals (6:30-7:30 p.m.)

Accompany choir for Sunday morning rehearsals in between worship services (9:00 a.m.)

• Play for special services throughout the year (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good

Friday, Easter, Christmas Eve Services)

• Serve as first choice (with right of first refusal) for weddings and funerals with additional

compensation

• Work with a handbell ensemble a few times annually

• Work under the direction of the Director of Music and clergy on worship music planning

• Communicate with Director of Music regarding the care and maintenance of the organ

and pianos

Flexible schedule:

- Practice, preparation, and planning are at organist's discretion
- Four paid Sundays off annually, with additional time off possible
- Work with the Director of Music to find suitable substitutes during times of absences

Compensation & Benefits:

- Initial compensation: \$26,000 annually
- Four Sundays off per year at full pay
- Flexibility in scheduling for practice and preparation

- Organist/Music Associate is allowed to use church facilities to teach organ and piano lessons as long as it doesn't conflict with daily and weekly business of the church.
